Spring Quarter 2024: Course Descriptions

Undergraduate Courses:

BI108: General Epistles and Revelation - A synthetic study of the contents and major problems of epistles Paul wrote after Acts, the Epistle to the Hebrews and the general epistles of James, John, Peter and Jude. A synthetic study of the contents and major problems of the book of Revelation. The problem of a chronology of the book and the problem of the symbolic language in the book will be covered.

GS112: God in History - An examination of the dispensations of Scripture with an emphasis on Law, grace and the kingdom. The covenants are studied as a basis for premillennialism.

ST124: Doctrines of Angels and Demons - 3 units

Angelology will be a study of the orders of spirit-beings, their works and methods. Demonology and Satanology will be included.

PM136: Biblical Preaching 3 - 3 units

Problem-centered sermons and first-person narrative sermons are developed using expository preaching. Practice preaching and worship leading occupies a large segment of class time with constant evaluation by the professor and members of the class. Pre-requisite: Course PM135

CE142: Introduction to Christian Education - A survey of Christian Education at work in the local church. An overview of the aims, principles, leadership, organization and agencies of a Biblical program of Christian Education for all age groups.

Graduate Courses:

GS213: Introduction to Research Methods - This required course introduces the student to resources available to do extended research.

BL233: Old Testament Hebrew Exegesis 3: The Writings - Exegesis in the poetic books of the Old Testament; focusing on interpretive and theological problems of biblical poetic literature. (One year Hebrew required).

C. REFUND POLICY

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

1. You have the right to cancel your agreement for a program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first class session or the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.

- 2. Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at: 1712 Alcatraz Avenue, Berkeley, CA 94703 by hand delivery; 2000 Allston Way, Box 557, Berkeley, CA 94701 by mail; or email baycitiesbiblecollege@gmail.com.
- 3. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage.
- 4. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
- 5. If the Enrollment Agreement is cancelled the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$250.00, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE PROGRAM

You may withdraw from the school at any time after the cancellation period (described above) and receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance. The refund will be less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$250.00, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition, within 45 days of withdrawal. If the student has completed more than 60% of the period of attendance for which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund.

For the purpose of determining a refund under this section, a student shall be deemed to have withdrawn from a program of instruction when any of the following occurs:

- The student notifies the institution of the student's withdrawal or as of the date of the student's withdrawal, whichever is later.
- The institution terminates the student's enrollment for failure to maintain satisfactory progress; failure to abide by the rules and regulations of the institution; absences in excess of maximum set forth by the institution; and/or failure to meet financial obligations to the School.
- The student has failed to attend class for three (3) consecutive weeks.
- The student fails to return from a leave of absence.

For the purpose of determining the amount of the refund, the date of the student's withdrawal shall be deemed the last date of recorded attendance. The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, minus non-refundable fees, divided

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by the number of days in the program), multiplied by the number of days scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal. For the purpose of determining when the refund must be paid, the student shall be deemed to have withdrawn at the end of three (3) consecutive weeks. If the student has completed more than 60% of the period of attendance for which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund.

If any portion of the tuition was paid from the proceeds of a loan or third party, the refund shall be sent to the lender, third party or, if appropriate, to the state or federal agency that guaranteed or reinsured the loan. Any amount of the refund in excess of the unpaid balance of the loan shall be first used to repay any student financial aid programs from which the student received benefits, in proportion to the amount of the benefits received, and any remaining amount shall be paid to the student. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
