Fall Quarter 2024: Course Descriptions

Undergraduate Courses:

BI101: The Pentateuch - The five books of Moses are treated as God's initial revelation in His redemptive program for man. Particular emphasis will be given to Israel's place in that program as it is unfolded in the Pentateuch.

GS113: Christian Lifestyle - This course seeks to prepare the student to live out the Christian faith and life in a consistent manner. There is an emphasis on the content of salvation, prayer and Bible study leading to the absolute assurance of salvation.

ST125: Doctrine of Salvation - The doctrine of salvation will be studied on the basis of the Biblical revelation. The death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ will be considered as they relate to the unlimited scope of His work on the cross in its finished aspects.

Bl128: New Testament Greek I - A study of New Testament Greek grammar with intensive drill in vocabulary, conjugations, declensions and grammatical constructions. Pre-requisite: Course BI 109.

CE143: Christian Education of Children - A practical look at all aspects of children's ministry in the local church. This course will provide a Biblical framework for Children's ministry, including use of the Bible, the settings in which Children's ministry is focused and varied approaches in teaching.

PM146: Pastoral Ministries I - This course studies the role of the pastor, whether the student is in an existing or future ministry context, to better understand themselves, the process of their personal leadership style and explore personal and private areas of their life that they may not be aware of in an ever-changing world.

Graduate Courses:

BI 201 Bible Exegesis I: Narrative Literature - In depth exposition of Old and New Testament biblical narrative literature from the English text, focusing on outlining passages, determining common themes and identifying key theological ideas in narrative literature. Pre-Requisite: Course BI 109

BI 206 Old Testament Introduction - A study of the background of the Old Testament, focusing on introductory problems, authorship, and date, along with an examination of higher critical issues inherent in the Old Testament.

C. REFUND POLICY

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

1. You have the right to cancel your agreement for a program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first class session or the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.

- 2. Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at: 1712 Alcatraz Avenue, Berkeley, CA 94703 by hand delivery; 2000 Allston Way, Box 557, Berkeley, CA 94701 by mail; or email baycitiesbiblecollege@gmail.com.
- 3. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage.
- 4. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
- 5. If the Enrollment Agreement is cancelled the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$250.00, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE PROGRAM

You may withdraw from the school at any time after the cancellation period (described above) and receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance. The refund will be less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$250.00, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition, within 45 days of withdrawal. If the student has completed more than 60% of the period of attendance for which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund.

For the purpose of determining a refund under this section, a student shall be deemed to have withdrawn from a program of instruction when any of the following occurs:

- The student notifies the institution of the student's withdrawal or as of the date of the student's withdrawal, whichever is later.
- The institution terminates the student's enrollment for failure to maintain satisfactory progress; failure to abide by the rules and regulations of the institution; absences in excess of maximum set forth by the institution; and/or failure to meet financial obligations to the School.
- The student has failed to attend class for three (3) consecutive weeks.
- The student fails to return from a leave of absence.

For the purpose of determining the amount of the refund, the date of the student's withdrawal shall be deemed the last date of recorded attendance. The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, minus non-refundable fees, divided

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by the number of days in the program), multiplied by the number of days scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal. For the purpose of determining when the refund must be paid, the student shall be deemed to have withdrawn at the end of three (3) consecutive weeks. If the student has completed more than 60% of the period of attendance for which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund.

If any portion of the tuition was paid from the proceeds of a loan or third party, the refund shall be sent to the lender, third party or, if appropriate, to the state or federal agency that guaranteed or reinsured the loan. Any amount of the refund in excess of the unpaid balance of the loan shall be first used to repay any student financial aid programs from which the student received benefits, in proportion to the amount of the benefits received, and any remaining amount shall be paid to the student. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
